## **Programme of Study**

#### Autumn Term Teacher 1

 Writing skills practice; analysis of part 1 of the anthology and other prose non-fiction: preparation for the English Language examination (2 hours 15 mins) (60%)

Cross-curricular links (including PSHE and values): exploration, war, judgement, cultural values and numerous other topics broached

ICT opportunities: using the internet to research the authors and topics; devising PowerPoint presentations; drafting revision notes and essays on Word

- 'Of Mice and Men', John Steinbeck: preparation for the prose section of the Literature closed book examination (60% in total; 2 hours)
- Cross-curricular links (including PSHE and values): prejudice; Depression era USA; ranch life/agricultural livelihoods; communities and ostracism; vigilantism, law and justice; sex and sexism

ICT opportunities: using the internet to research the author and historical context; devising PowerPoint presentations; drafting revision notes and essays on Word; audiovisual viewing

#### **Autumn Term** Teacher 2

 Creative writing task: English Language coursework piece (20%) based on a subject of choice (650-800 words approximately)
 Cross-curricular links (including PSHE and values): could be focused upon or inspired by any issues relevant to morality/spirituality of a student's choosing

ICT opportunities: using the internet to research stimulus material; drafting the response in Word

 Drafting of response to part 2 of the anthology, English Language coursework piece (20%) analysing poetry or prose (650-800 words approximately +200-300 word commentary)

Cross-curricular links (including PSHE and values): culture, war, death, class gender and numerous others addressed throughout the collection

ICT opportunities: using the internet to research the authors and historical contexts; devising PowerPoint presentations; drafting revision notes and essay on Word

## Spring Term Teacher 1

 Analysis of part 3 of the anthology and a range of poetry: preparation for the English Literature examination (60% in total; 2 hours)

Cross-curricular links (including PSHE and values): war, death, childhood, family, prejudice, industrialisation and numerous other topics throughout collection; due to breadth of study, can span any manner of topics relevant to current affairs/student preference/school focuses at teacher's discretion

ICT opportunities: using the internet to research the authors and historical contexts; devising PowerPoint presentations; drafting revision notes and essays on Word

## Spring Term Teacher 2

 'A View from the Bridge', Arthur Miller or 'An Inspector Calls', JB Priestley: drafting of English Literature coursework response (20%) comprising of an essay of 650-800 words approximately

Cross-curricular links (including PSHE and values): ethics; class/status; power; inequality; family; socialism; community

ICT opportunities: using the internet to research historical context; devising PowerPoint presentations; drafting notes and essay on Word; audiovisual viewing

 'Romeo and Juliet' or 'Macbeth', Shakespeare: drafting of English Literature coursework response (20%) comprising of an essay of 650-800 words approximately
